

East Valley Institute of Technology and UAT Articulation Agreement

The University of Advancing Technology and East Valley Institute of Technology have entered into this Articulation Agreement (“Agreement”) which sets forth criteria by which college credit at The University of Advancing Technology may be awarded to East Valley Institute of Technology students. Effective upon the date of signing, The University of Advancing Technology and East Valley Institute of Technology agree to enter into an articulation to benefit the graduates of East Valley Institute of Technology who have successfully completed the courses and requirements listed below and wish to pursue an academic program at The University of Advancing Technology (UAT).

The following criteria are required:

1. The student must graduate from high school and have completed the courses listed above with a grade of “B” or higher.
2. Meet the admission policy requirement of The University of Advancing Technology and be admitted as a degree-seeking student within 15 months of high school graduation. The student must submit:
 - a) A completed High School Student Request for Articulated Credit Form to apply for articulated credit (listed above) from UAT.
 - b) An official high school transcript indicating the grade received in the




course(s) listed above as well as the date of graduation.

The following supplemental criteria may be required as applicable:

- a) A letter of recommendation on school letterhead from the high school teacher and/or counselor confirming the student has achieved the knowledge and skills for the course competencies required.
- b) A copy of curriculum map/ syllabus of program.
- c) Any other evidence of student learning that the Institute believes demonstrates the award of credit to this particular student is merited.

This Agreement is effective upon the date of the last signature and shall remain in effect through the 2025 academic year. Each party agrees to notify the other of any changes in their respective curriculum that would necessitate a re-evaluation of the agreement. Thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically renew for additional two-year term(s) or until modified or cancelled in writing. The University of Advancing Technology Institute reserves the right to enter into similar agreements with other schools.
